Sermon Topic

May 13/14 2017

Lydia

Proverbs 31:10-31, Acts 16:14-15, Luke 24:44-49

hat is one of the first things you ask someone new when you're getting to know them? I can think of five or six common starter questions covering home town, family, hobbies, interests, or where they went to school. I think one of the most common, however, is "Where do you work?".

I know I find myself answering that question regularly when meeting new people. In some ways, it feels like "work" has come to define who we are. Increasingly, people are finding their worth and self-esteem in their jobs instead of in their Creator.

Interestingly, we don't know much about today's *Obscure Character from the Bible*. The book of Acts reveals her job, but also something much deeper:

One who heard us was a woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple goods, who was a worshiper of God. The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what was said by Paul. Acts 16:14 (ESV)

For those who know Lydia, the first (or only) fact they could tell you about her is that she is a "seller of purple goods". It's the second descriptor that's more meaningful however: Lydia was a "worshiper of God". Luke would continue with how "the Lord opened her heart" to Paul's message that day and how she and her household were baptized (verse 15).

I suspect that Lydia found her worth not in the selling of purple goods, but in Jesus whom she worshiped. What about you? Are you letting your job (or lack of job) define who you are and ascribe worth and meaning to your life or are you letting God define you? Work is important, valuable, and a gift from God. But let's be careful to never let the gift define us over the giver.


