1. The people gathered for _____.

On the first day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul began talking to them. **Acts 20:7**

Is not the cup of blessing which we bless a sharing in the blood of Christ? Is not the bread which we break a sharing in the body of Christ? Since there is one bread, we who are many are one body; for we all partake of the one bread.

Paul began talking to them, intending to leave the next day, and prolonged his message until midnight. **Acts 20:7**

For where two or three have gathered together in My name, I am there in their midst. **Matthew 18:20**

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. **John 3:16**

And there was a young man named Eutychus sitting on the window sill, sinking into a deep sleep; and as Paul kept on talking, he was overcome by sleep and fell down from the third floor and was picked up dead. **Acts 20:9**

But Paul went down and fell upon him, and after embracing him, he said, "Do not be troubled, for his life is in him." **Acts 20:10**

These signs will accompany those who have believed: in My name they will cast out demons, they will speak with new tongues; they will pick up serpents, and if they drink any deadly poison, it will not hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover. **Mark 16:17-18**
